Vijay Memorial College of Education has organised Guest Lecture on "Right Career Right Path" Guest lecture delivered by our B. Ed alumnus who has qualified N. E. T in commerce has delivered a lecture on the Topic "Right career right path".

To motivate students and give guidance on how to qualify competitive Exams Mr Abhisek deliver Lecture on "Right Career, Right Path". He said that Various Career opportunities after B.Ed. in both sectors (Govt. & Private). Skills, Qualifications & Job Profile required for those posts. But for the teaching Job first step is eligibility criteria. Teaching exams are conducted every year at the national and state level including TET, NET and SET. In order to get recruited as a teacher or lecturer, a candidate needs to be eligible and qualify the required eligibility tests. To become a teacher in central or state government schools, candidates need to qualify the CTET, TET. He said that NET is an exam conducted at the national level to determine the eligibility of candidates for the post of Assistant Professor and/or the award of Junior Research Fellowship (JRF). Candidates qualifying the NET exam get eligible to apply for a government job in Indian universities and colleges as lecturers or Assistant Professors. Candidates qualifying NET exam for JRF get eligible to pursue research in their chosen subject in Indian universities and colleges.

Vijay Memorial College of Education organized a guest lecture on "Anti ragging awareness". Resource person for this lecture was Ms Lata Thakur Assistant Professor Education at Vijay Memorial College of Education Barsu.

Ms Lata Thakur delivered a lecture on the topic "Anti Ragging Awareness". She started her speech with an explanation to world "ragging". She told new definition for ragging is Any act of physical or mental abuse targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background. She appraised the gathering about the consequences of ragging which in her opinion would be devastating for both the parties. She said that even the honorable Supreme Court in its order has banned ragging in any form in institutions and many educational authorities like UGC, AICTE, and the Government has issued stern warning against ragging and proposed ways and means to curb the menace of ragging. She discussed different measures for curbing ragging. Also, she explained legal provisions banning the provisions of ragging in India. In the session she highlighted all the landmark cases pertaining to ragging delivered by judisuries at large. She emphatically reiterated the reasons for why ragging should not at all be tolerated at any cost. She hoped that the institution had planned well to prohibit, prevent and eliminate incident of ragging in the campus.
